BILL BURNS ANNOUNCES CANDIDACY FOR JEFFERSONVILLE MAYOR

Jeffersonville small businessman Bill Burns today announced his candidacy to seek the Republican nomination for Jeffersonville Mayor next year.

In a video posted to social media, Burns said “it’s an exciting time in Jeffersonville. We’ve enjoyed many successes. But I believe our city’s best days are still ahead. And getting there will take leadership.”

Burns, who has served on the Jeffersonville City Council since 2020 representing District 2, said his mayoral campaign puts forth a vision that focuses on building upon the city’s successes while creating opportunities for everyone.

“Our campaign is about people. It’s about listening and building a better future for mine and your grandchildren,” said Burns who owns and operates REMAX FIRST and Aristocrat Tile in Jeffersonville. “On the City Council, I championed equitable growth and collaborative decision-making. I will do the same as Mayor.”

Burns noted that the next Mayor will face some daunting fiscal challenges in the wake of state legislation that ultimately will reduce tax revenue. “As a small business owner, I know what it takes to meet a payroll and live within your means. I’m well qualified to help the city overcome these challenges without jeopardizing essential city services.”

Burns is a lifelong Jeffersonville resident who is married to Angie. He is the father of two children and four grandchildren.

“Growing up in Jeff, I learned the values of working hard, keeping your word and giving back to the community. Over the years, my hometown has given me opportunities I could only have dreamed of. I look forward to helping write Jeffersonville’s next chapter,” said Burns.

Mayor Mike Moore announced his retirement earlier this year after four terms as Mayor. The Republican Primary will take place on May 4, 2027 and the general election will take place on November 2, 2027.

“Over the next several months, I want to connect with the residents of Jeff. I’m looking forward to hearing their thoughts and talk about the future of the city we love so much,” said Burns who will host a campaign kick-off on July 8 at 6 p.m. at the Carriage House located at 1101 E. Market St. in Jeffersonville.
